The Law, Science & Human Factors Impacting Use of Force & Sudden In-Custody Death Investigations

Annually law enforcement managers and executives are faced with investigating a departmental officer involved use of force incident. These investigations are critical in determining whether the officer properly responded to the circumstances, whether the incident resulted in a significant injury, death from an officer involved shooting, or from a sudden in-custody death. Numerous questions will emerge and the political fallout within the community can be polarizing. This 8-hour course will address key investigation components which every investigator should consider when tasked with performing this assignment. The course also integrates the law, science, and human factors which emerge from these incidents.

The course outlines. . .

- Assessing officer perception and the science of the brain
- Examining perceptual distortions, stress, and its impact on field performance and the investigation
- Problems associated with investigating officer-involved shootings
- Etiology of sudden in-custody deaths
- Examining deaths from substance abuse, the use of restraints, pepper spray, neck restraints, and conducted energy devices

The Instructor—Darrell L. Ross, Ph.D.

Dr. Ross is the Department Head and Professor of Sociology, Anthropology and Criminal Justice at Valdosta State University and the former Director of the School of Law Enforcement and Justice Administration at Western Illinois University. He has conducted research and provided training for police and correctional agencies, taught subject control tactics and physical conditioning in the police academy setting, and also taught academic courses. A former employee of the Michigan Department of Corrections, Dr. Ross worked as an officer, a Unit Manager of a psychiatric cell block of 500 prisoners, a probation officer, and academy instructor. Dr. Ross is an author of multiple books including Civil Liability Issues in Corrections, Civil Liability in Criminal Justice, 4th Ed., and Sudden Death in Custody.
